Dear Members

Apologies for not being able to attend this AGM as I am babysitting my grandchildren in New Zealand for the last week of their school holidays.

2018 has been successful with 94 branch members. We held 6 demonstration/meeting days and 3 additional workshops. Juniors met 5 times and their membership stood at 22. At our final meeting of the year, the Christmas Lunch, **Lesley Neve** was presented with the Fay Gardner Award for outstanding service to the branch.

Our biggest challenge has been parking with so many sporting events nearby. The short hands-on workshops on the demonstration days have been enthusiastically embraced by some members and particularly appeal to younger and newer members. I believe it is very worthwhile to offer this

format as it gives participants an opportunity to "have a go" in a supportive and friendly environment and is surely the cheapest cake decorating learning environment in Sydney!

Our 3 half-day workshops were also appreciated by the attendees and being able to piggyback on the Juniors' booking of the smaller part of the venue in alternate months makes it an economical proposition.

I would like to acknowledge the continuing efforts of the Committee who get the meetings up and running and look after the behind-the-scenes record keeping and financial matters. While it *appears* effortless, I can assure you there is in fact much thought and planning that goes into delivering everything and we all owe a debt of gratitude to them. I am not standing for another term as President as I have too many other commitments but it has been a privilege to serve and be part of the team for the past two years.

I urge others to put themselves forward to make their contribution to the future of the branch. There are so many good ideas discussed over the tea and coffee but good ideas by themselves don't change anything and fresh faces and ideas are vital to any organisation.

The Sydney Branch celebrates 40 years this year .. an achievement to be proud of! I wish everyone well and anticipate another successful year in 2019.

pack down on meeting days and everyone of course loves her delicious pavlovas! Thank you Lesley for all you do for the Sydney Branch.



Sugar Showcase 2020

The theme is "Made in Australia" and only Australian demonstrators will be invited.

A venue is being sought and branches' assistance in looking for somewhere suitable is most welcome.

It was proposed that the display cases not be used. Two reasons - they are time consuming to erect and dismantle and no cakes were damaged by the public at *Cake, Bake and Sweets*.

Sydney Royal Easter Show 2019

Tentative date for Guild demonstrations is Sunday, 14 April 2019. Local branches will be contacted as soon as that is confirmed to see who would like to demonstrate. Sylvia Fitch will co-ordinate.

Request from RAS and acceptance from CDG of NSW Inc to donate \$650 towards cash prizes in Sugar Art section. This is an increase of \$150 as a new category has been added - *Gravity Defying*.

Jan Boon advised that there will be new display cabinets for Sugar Art.

Judges' Sub Committee Report

The Judges were thanked for attending diligently to their appointments. Local shows are being contacted for their requirements for 2019.

The *Sydney Royal Show* Schedule for 2019 is available online. All recommendations from the Guild Judges development weekend were accepted by the RAS and mistakes found in the 2018 schedule have been rectified for 2019.

Cake, Bake and Sweets Show

This was held on 23 - 25 November 2018. The competition had 30 entries and all processes went smoothly. *Loyal* were the main sponsors and have

pledged support for the 2019 CBSS.

The Guild will again assist at the 2019 show which will be held on 8 - 10 November at the Convention Centre, Darling Harbour.
