

A Look Back on 40 Years - Mysteries in Springtime 2002



Spotlight on a Cake Decorator - Regina Prasad



How long have you been decorating cakes and what inspired you to get started?

I was encouraged by a friend to try some cake decorating lessons, suggesting I'd enjoy it. I took some lessons in 2015 with Macquarie Community

College and am so glad I did!

How long have you been a member of the Guild?

I'm a newbie .. a member since 2016.

What do you enjoy about the Guild meetings?

There are always new techniques and ideas for me to observe and learn from. It's

amazing the number of tips I pick up just by



watching demonstrators at work. My knowledge and skills have improved greatly since joining the Guild.

Most memorable cake?

I'm still fairly new to cake decorating and can't really say I have any outstanding cakes. Ask me again in a few years!

One cake decorating tool you could not live without?

When I had lessons with Jean Palmer, she gave me one of her blue modelling sticks – that's probably one of the tools I find most useful!

What is the most rewarding part of cake decorating?

As many others have noted here, nothing really beats seeing the joy and happiness on people's

faces (especially children!) when they set eyes on the finished product. It's a very special feeling!

What is your biggest challenge as a cake decorator?

Every cake I've decorated has had its own challenges. When you're a novice, there are many firsts - first giraffe, first geisha, first Olaf and each one is a challenge. I've spent many hours watching and learning from YouTube



videos. It's been a huge learning curve!

Do you have any other hobbies or interests apart from cake decorating?

Now that I'm retired, I'm really enjoying travelling. Just back from a Dubai to Singapore cruise and



looking forward to our next trip to the Canadian Rockies plus the Alaska Inlet Passage cruise.

I also love gardening – mainly vegetables, African Violets and orchids.

If you had one piece of advice for a new decorator, what would it be?

Lots and *lots* of practise! It's a very time consuming hobby with a lot of trial and error but I've found that it's always worth the effort in the end. Hard to beat the sense of pride and satisfaction when you

see the finished product!
